Members-at-large may order directly from Paul and arrange shipping or printing options, fees may apply.



Tool Tip:

Increase productivity by wearing whole canvas gloves to polish edges of belts and straps. Simply hold, apply pressure to the edges and pull the belt through your hand.

White cotton, jewellery inspection gloves are soft and lightweight. Cut all the fingers shorter, except the small finger, in order to protect the leather from your hand(s) during stamping and carving.


We received this message from Madeleine Mitchell.....
