 - d) Craft Ribbons – A Majority of Judges scoring an item over 80 will result in a Ribbon

 - f) The Best of Level will be given for 3 or more members entering in each level
 - g) Photos will be Available for Members to see
 - h) Category for Prizes picked by Judges CSCL Cash Prizes and Awards Best Moulding, Best Tooling or Colouring (Robert Muma Award \$50), Best Hard Sculpture (\$20), Woodstock Heritage (\$50). Best General Member, Best Fellow, Best in Show (\$50) and other Categories as deemed necessary.
