

CSSL Archive — People of the Society

Every person the Society recorded, with the office, certification, award, honour or remembrance held for each.

Overview

The archive now names **217** distinct people, in two groups:

189 people carried in the Society's records (Part A) — named through an office, a certification, an award, an honour, a competition entry, a biography, or an in-memoriam notice. Each has a full structured record.

28 further members from the membership lists (Part B) — recorded with their branch and joining year only.

This register is generated directly from the archive's structured data files, so it is an exact reflection of what the archive holds — nothing is transcribed by hand.

Within the records group: 80 held an office · 35 hold a Fellow/Associate certification · 88 won a competition award · 48 received an honour · 44 are remembered in memoriam. 35 are recorded under more than one spelling; every variant is printed beneath the name it files under.
