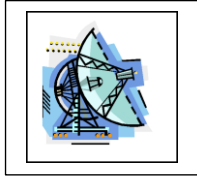

Workshop Tips from 1974

From the 1974 Winter Edition of Canadian Leathercraft

- **Plastic from Ice Cream containers, detergent bottles, etc. make excellent pattern templates for belt tips and buckle ends, as well as flowers, leaves, and small animals**
- **A dried-up ball point pen makes a useful stylus**
- **A French Curve is a handy gadget when working out designs. (Available at Art Supply Stores)**
- **Remove one of the beaters from an electric hand mixer. Fasten a square of sheepskin over the beater with an elastic band. This makes an excellent buffer.**
